Apple Unveils New iBook Line

All New Colors Plus iMovie 2 for Portable Video Editing

APPLE EXPO PARIS—September 13, 2000 Apple® today introduced a new iBook™ line featuring FireWire® ports and iMovie™ 2, the world's most popular and easy-to-use digital video editing software, and all new colors. The iBook now comes in Indigo and the iBook Special Edition, which now includes a DVD-ROM drive for watching DVD movies on the go, comes in Graphite. Both models also come in the season's hottest new color, Key Lime, available exclusively from Apple's Online Store (www.apple.com).

"iBook has been a big hit with consumers, students and educators, and the addition of portable digital video editing with FireWire and iMovie 2 makes it even better," said Steve Jobs, Apple's CEO. "Anyone can now own a portable movie studio for just \$1,499."

- iBook Special Edition, available in Graphite, features a 466 MHz PowerPC G3 processor, with 64MB of SDRAM, 256K level 2 cache, a 10GB IDE hard drive, 6x-speed DVD-ROM drive, USB and FireWire ports, a built-in 56K modem, 10/100BASE-T Ethernet and iMovie 2 for an estimated retail price of US\$1,799.

Both iBook and iBook Special Edition are available in Key Lime through the Apple Store.

Have you been to Las Vegas? Do you like slot machines? Well if so, maybe "Slots" is for you! On this CD-ROM, there are 50 different slot machines and you can create a ****hotlist**** of your favorites. You can only play one machine at a time. Slots is a collection of actual casino slot machines, such as IGT machines which include Red, White & Blue, Double Diamond, Wild Cherry, 10 Times Pay, Sizzling 7's, etc.

Are you a high-roller? In Slots, you may choose either Quarter (\$0.25), \$1, or \$5 stakes. You can choose your credits to use in the slot machine, with the maximum being set at 500. It's as simple as using the up and down arrows, or highlighting the amount. This is the amount that you start with each time you select a slot machine.

More than one person can play these games and you can choose to add or delete players. You can keep track of winnings by player name or slot machine name. There are also Preferences to control sounds and payouts.

These are some of the games I played:

BlackJack (1 Coin, 1 Line)

BlackJack is the game to play when you only want to bet one credit per pull without missing out on any bonus opportunities. It accepts only \$5 tokens. The BlackJack symbol is wild and substitutes for any symbol.

Cats and Dogs (2 Coins, 1 Line)

The Dog Wild! symbol substitutes for any symbol except the Cat Wild! symbol when on the payline. The Cat Wild! symbol sub-

stitutes for any symbol except the Dog Wild! symbol when on the payline.

Hot Peppers (3 Coins, 1 Line)

The Double Peppers symbols are wild and match any other symbols on the payline. One Double Peppers symbol doubles the winning combination, two Double Peppers symbols pay 4X the winning combination, except on Any One or Any Two Double Pepper pays and when three Hot Peppers symbols show on the payline.

Version 1.0.5 is the latest version. There are patches on the website to correct bugs in previous versions. Visit the website at <http://www.masque.com>

The graphics were not invocative of a real casino. All you see on your screen is a small square showing the window of the slot machine. You click on the slot machine arm with your mouse and watch the window spin and wait to see what lines up on the payline. This game would have been more enticing to use if the graphics had made the player feel as if he/she were actually sitting at a slot machine in a gaming room in Las Vegas. There should have been some type of interaction with a character, such as a dealer or other players, to give playing the game some personality. I think it would be more fun to play online against others or at any of the online gaming sites and win some REAL money!!

What Do I Save This As??

Here's a good rule of thumb:

If you are working with pixels (raster images) and want to save the image in a format that others can use, save it as a TIFF file.

If you are working with Objects (vector images) and want to save the image in a format that others can use, save it as an EPS file.

If you want to use the graphic on the World Wide Web, save it as a GIF or JPEG. Most illustrated images with areas of flat color are best saved as GIF's, and most photographs with subtle color changes are best saved as JPEG's. For a GIF, change the mode to Indexed Color and save it at the lowest bit depth (lowest number of colors) that will maintain the image. Both GIF and JPEG are raster formats.

An area of concern for many is - what format do I use to save this? Programs like AppleWorks, PageMaker, QuarkXPress and Photoshop have lots of ways to save information. The decision of what to use becomes easier as one gains experience. The following list may provide some insight in choosing the right format.

🍏 ASCII: American Standard Code for Information Interchange is the oldest file interchange format. No formatting information is contained in ASCII, but the Mac understands a modified version of ASCII that contains 256 characters, including special symbols and accent markings.

🍏 BinHex: A method of converting Mac files for safe transmission on UNIX servers.

🍏 DIF: Data Interchange Format. A PC-based file format used to transfer spreadsheet and database information between applications. Cell width and height information is lost during translation.

🍏 GIF: Graphics Interchange Format. A file format commonly used with graphics or photos displayed on Web documents. It is the most supported and popular graphics format on the Web. Originally popularized by CompuServe.

🍏 GIF animation: Combining several GIFs into one image through scripting. When viewed through a Web browser, the image flips through the various frames, thus creating animation.

🍏 JPEG: Joint Photographic Experts Group. A graphic image compression format.

🍏 EPS: Encapsulated PostScript. A file interchange format for converting PostScript-based graphics and special effects from native formats to a printable format. Only PostScript devices can understand and print EPS graphics.

🍏 MacBinary: A file interchange format used for transmitting Mac files securely over networks. MacBinary files are indicated by a .BIN suffix.

🍏 PDF: Portable Document Format. Used to display documents on computers that might not have the document's original application or fonts resident. Adobe offers a free reader, called Acrobat, and a suite of software for sale that you can use to create PDF files.

🍏 PICT: The basic Mac graphics format encoded into QuickDraw.


🍏 RTF: Rich Text Format. A popular file interchange format that retains a great deal of formatting and font information when files are exchanged by applications.

🍏 TIFF: Tagged-Image File Format. Used to transfer bitmapped images between computer platforms. TIFF is useful because its independent of specific computer or graphic resolutions.
