Adobe Acrobat 4.0

Acrobat says it will work on OS 7.5.3 (8.6 required for web capture), 6 MB RAM (12 recommended), 16 MB RAM for Distiller (used for graphic capture), 32 MB RAM recommended) 60 MB HD space, CD-ROM drive.

For years, being in business and working on a Macintosh meant being continually confronted with cross platform exchange issues. If you designed something on a Mac while your client worked on a PC, you had few options for sharing your information, which made project-in-progress approvals time consuming. Color screen shots, even though they are saved in simple text, don't open on all machines. Faxes send a messy black and white image. Snail mail is slow.

The most important tool in conquering this problem is Adobe Acrobat. In a perfect world, we wouldn't need Acrobat, but in today's world it is the answer to a prayer. With Acrobat, you can preserve the precise look of your document (including color, fonts, graphics, etc), save it in a smaller size, deliver it electronically, regardless of platform, and provide a means for the recipient to interact with you about it. The key is a PDF, Portable Document File.

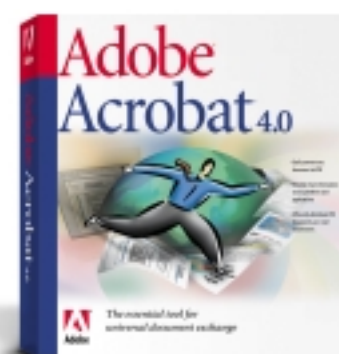
If you're reading this on your computer, you're already familiar with Acrobat Reader, a free download that makes it possible to read PDF files. Despite their rela-

tively small size, PDF files are capable of carrying enormous quantities of data customized for individual use. All of these reasons and more are why our newsletter is delivered as a PDF. Everything about PDF files says convenience.

Hot links can be embedded in the file which means the recipient can activate web locations and e-mail directly from the document. PDFs encourage interactivity between the creator and the recipient. Recipients can enter the document to place annotations beside the area they're critiquing. These annotations aren't restricted to written notes either. You can stamp the document with resizable graphic labels such as draft, or approved. You can return the document to its original sender with new links, highlighted or crossed out lines, even attached sound and movie files that convert your document into a multimedia experience. PDF files are designed to make electronic communications between groups or individuals as complete as possible. They are clearly the wave of the future.

The Acrobat workspace can be devoted entirely to the document or vertically shared with a navigation area. The navigation pane contains easy to use palettes that can be anchored or floated. The Bookmark palette allows you to access tagged areas of long documents with a single click. Page views can also be linked allowing a viewer to jump from one image to another or create links to web sites. The Thumbnail palette displays all pages in a small enough size to allow you to

rearrange pages within a document simply by dragging them to a new location. The Annotations palette allows you to read comments left by others and to insert your own comments into the document. This interactivity centers on the precise item under concern. Annotations can be placed anywhere you want. If there are a lot of annotations coming from a number of different people, you can create a document with a summary of all annotations. The final palette relates to signatures. Digital signatures for signing documents can be added here.

Tool icons run the vertical length of the screen. Menus and a row of commands run horizontally along the top of the screen. A status bar lets you immediately change the on-screen display with a toggle switch that shows and hides the navigation pane. Once you sort it out, the capability is quite remarkable. PDFs can be made for viewing and/or printing purposes, just remember that the finer the quality, the larger the file. PDFs can even be made for the highest quality commercial printers. If you're constructing a web site, Acrobat files can be used to create electronic survey forms for use on-line. These forms can be customized to your needs or you can quickly convert your existing paper and electronic forms to PDF files letting you maintain your organization's corporate identity and branding, while saving you the effort of recreating the form. Just add PDF form fields and you're ready.

If you want to add a scan to your PDF document, Acrobat supports TWAIN scanner drivers which are industry-standards and compatible with almost all desktop scanners. They also supply Photoshop Acquire

plug-ins that will let you bring your scans directly into Photoshop where you can add modifications before you bring them into your PDF document. You can also use the Scan command to import images created by a digital camera, so long as the camera used a TWAIN driver.

Acrobat allows you to edit PDF documents in a variety of ways. You can edit text and graphics within a file, and a new feature allows you to edit images and line art using Adobe Photoshop 5.0 and Adobe Illustrator 7.0 or 8.0 (Windows) from within a PDF document. You can also crop and rotate pages in a PDF document. You can rearrange the order of pages in a document, add new pages, or extract pages from a PDF document and create an entirely new document with them.

HTML can be downloaded directly from the World Wide Web or an intranet and brought into Acrobat for conversion to a PDF. Once you provide the URL, Acrobat will convert and open the pages in one step.

Acrobat 4.0 allows you to make a PDF for either the Acrobat 3.0 or 4.0 reader, but the advantages of using 4.0 are numerous and clearly listed. Because the reader is free and an easily available download, I'd recommend creating PDFs in 4.0. Then, just make sure your recipient(s) are using 4.0 or are willing to upgrade from 3.0

My only complaint with this program is one I've had before. The help guide is written for someone who doesn't need it.
